Very Reliable and Low-Cost

Because the Model N was inexpensive, reliable, simple and small, it was a very popular automobile.

Two-seater runabouts like this 1907 Ford Model N were favored by middle-class Americans who could afford one. They were fast and rugged. Most runabouts featured one- or two-cylinder engines and bicycle-style chain drives. But this Ford Model N offered four cylinders and a shaft drive, plus it cost less. At \$600, it became the bestselling car in America.

Innovations

- Cast iron flywheel mounted to the front of the engine
- First Ford to employ mass production techniques
- Model N demonstrated Henry Ford's vision of the ideal product
- Piquette production reached 100 cars per day
